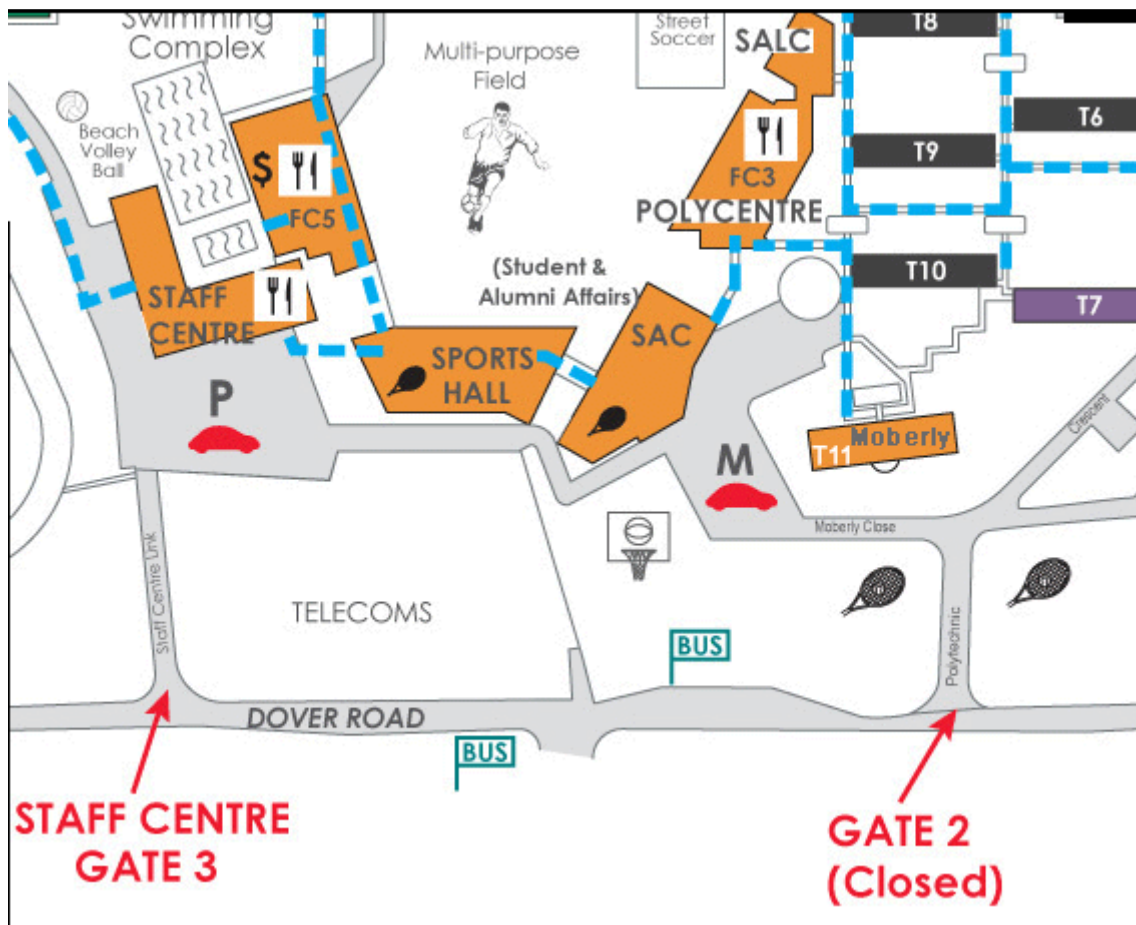

Resolution to change ICAAS Constitution

AGM 2009

Current Clause

10.9 All cheques shall, besides being stamped with the Association's seal, bear the signatures of at least two of the following officials:

The Vice President
The Honorary Secretary and
The Honorary Treasurer

10.9 All cheques shall, ~~besides being stamped with the Association's seal,~~ bear the signatures of at least two of the following officials:

The President
The Vice President
The Honorary Secretary and
The Honorary Treasurer

Current Clause

10.10 Cheques exceeding five hundred dollars may only be issued with the approval of the Committee. The Committee has the power to authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars per month from the Association's funds for the Association's purposes.

Proposed Change

10.10 Cheques exceeding two thousand dollars may only be issued with the approval of the Committee. The Committee has the power to authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars per month from the Association's funds for the Association's purposes.

Current Clause

13.3 Should there be no quorum present at a general meeting, the meeting shall be postponed to a date at least seven days after the date on which it was to have taken place. The members present at such a meeting shall then constitute the quorum but they shall not have the power to amend this Constitution if the stipulated quorum is not present.

Proposed Change

13.3 Should there be no quorum present at a general meeting, the meeting shall be adjourned for half an hour and should the number then present be insufficient to form a quorum, those present shall then constitute the quorum, but they shall have no power to amend this Constitution

Can Singapore Entrepreneurs Stand Out within the Seven-hour “Economic Hinterland”?
