NTU-Imperial College tie-up

NANYANG Technological University (NTU) is teaming up with Imperial College London to offer joint Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) programmes in engineering and science.

It is the first time both institutions are offering a joint PhD programme with a partner university.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was signed at NTU by Sir Roy M. Anderson, Rector, Imperial College and Dr Su Guaning, NTU President on Monday.

Said Dr Su: 'We are delighted to partner Imperial College London, a world renowned institution in education and research... The collaboration will benefit our students and facilitate and strengthen the research collaboration between the two universities.'

Rector of Imperial Sir Roy Anderson added: 'Imperial College London and Singapore make very good partners because we share an enthusiasm for scientific exploration and innovation. Formalising the strong links between Imperial and NTU means more students will benefit.'

The NTU-Imperial College Joint PhD degree programme will commence with PhD programmes in Bioengineering and Chemical, and Biomolecular Engineering. It will subsequently be extended to PhD degrees for all engineering and science disciplines.

The programme takes four years, with students spending two years at each institution.

Successful PhD candidates shall be jointly issued a PhD degree under the seals of Imperial College and NTU.

The tentative date for the initial intake under the Joint PhD programme is January 2010.
