

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)



What makes the NUS Computing CXO Series different?

The CXO Series combines NUS Computing's deep expertise in AI and emerging technologies with practical executive education designed specifically for senior leaders. Unlike longer executive programmes, each standalone module allows participants to focus on topics most relevant to their organisation while learning alongside a curated cohort of fellow decision-makers.

What will I gain from attending?

Each session is designed to provide practical insights that participants can apply immediately within their organisations. Through expert-led discussions, real-world case studies and peer learning, participants will gain strategic perspectives, decision making tools and implementation ideas on AI, emerging technologies and digital transformation to support better business and technology decisions.

What topics can I choose from?

Sessions cover areas such as AI strategy, generative AI, cybersecurity, digital transformation, data governance, emerging technologies, technology leadership and board governance.

How are the sessions conducted?

Sessions combine expert presentations, industry case studies, facilitated discussions and opportunities for peer exchange. The emphasis is on practical application and executive dialogue rather than academic lectures.

Do I need a technical background?

The CXO Series is designed specifically for senior leaders rather than technical specialists. There are no academic prerequisites or coding requirements. The programme focuses on strategic decision-making, governance, digital transformation and AI leadership—not programming.

Who are the other participants?

Participants are carefully selected to create a high-calibre peer learning environment comprising C-suite executives, senior technology and business leaders, board members and decision-makers from the public and private sectors from diverse industries.

When will the course take place?

The CXO Series will be held from 16–30 November 2026. Each module is a standalone three-hour executive session offered in either a morning (9am – 12pm) or afternoon (2pm – 5pm) slot. Participants may register for individual sessions or attend multiple modules according to their interests and schedule.

What is the time commitment required?

Each module is a standalone 3-hour executive session. Participants may register for individual sessions or attend multiple modules depending on their interests and schedule. There is no required pre-course preparation or post-course assessment.

The morning session starts from 9am – 12pm, though participants can arrive early at 8:30am for light breakfast and stay for lunch for networking; and the afternoon session starts from 2pm – 5pm, though participants can arrive early at 12:30pm to join in lunch for networking.

Are there opportunities for networking?

Every session includes opportunities to engage with fellow senior executives, faculty and industry leaders through facilitated discussions, interactive classroom activities, networking meals and refreshment breaks. Cohorts are intentionally curated to encourage meaningful peer learning across industries.

How many participants will be in each cohort?

Cohort sizes are kept intentionally small to ensure meaningful interaction with faculty and peer learning.

Is the course open to international participants?

Yes, the course welcomes senior leaders from Singapore, across the Asia-Pacific region and around the world. International participants requiring a visa should make their own travel arrangements and ensure they meet Singapore's entry requirements. Travel and related costs are not included in the course fees.

Where can international participants stay?

The course fee does not include accommodation. Participants may stay at on-campus The Ridge accommodation (subject to availability) or at nearby hotels in Rochester

Park, one-north, Buona Vista or Singapore's city centre, all of which offer convenient access to the NUS Kent Ridge campus via MRT and shuttle bus.

Where will the course be held?

Lessons will be conducted on the National University of Singapore (NUS) Kent Ridge campus, at COM3 SEA Building Executive Education rooms, providing access to a world-class learning environment. [How to get here.](#)

Where can I park on-campus?

How do I get here by car?

From the City

- Drive along the Ayer Rajah Expressway (AYE) towards Jurong
- Exit at South Buona Vista Rd (AYE Exit 8)
- Keep left to merge onto South Buona Vista Rd
- Use the right 2 lanes to turn right onto Kent Ridge Rd
- Turn left onto Prince George's Park
- After 1km, turn right onto Innovation 4.0 (Car Park 11B). We are at the COM3 SEA Building, #B1-27.

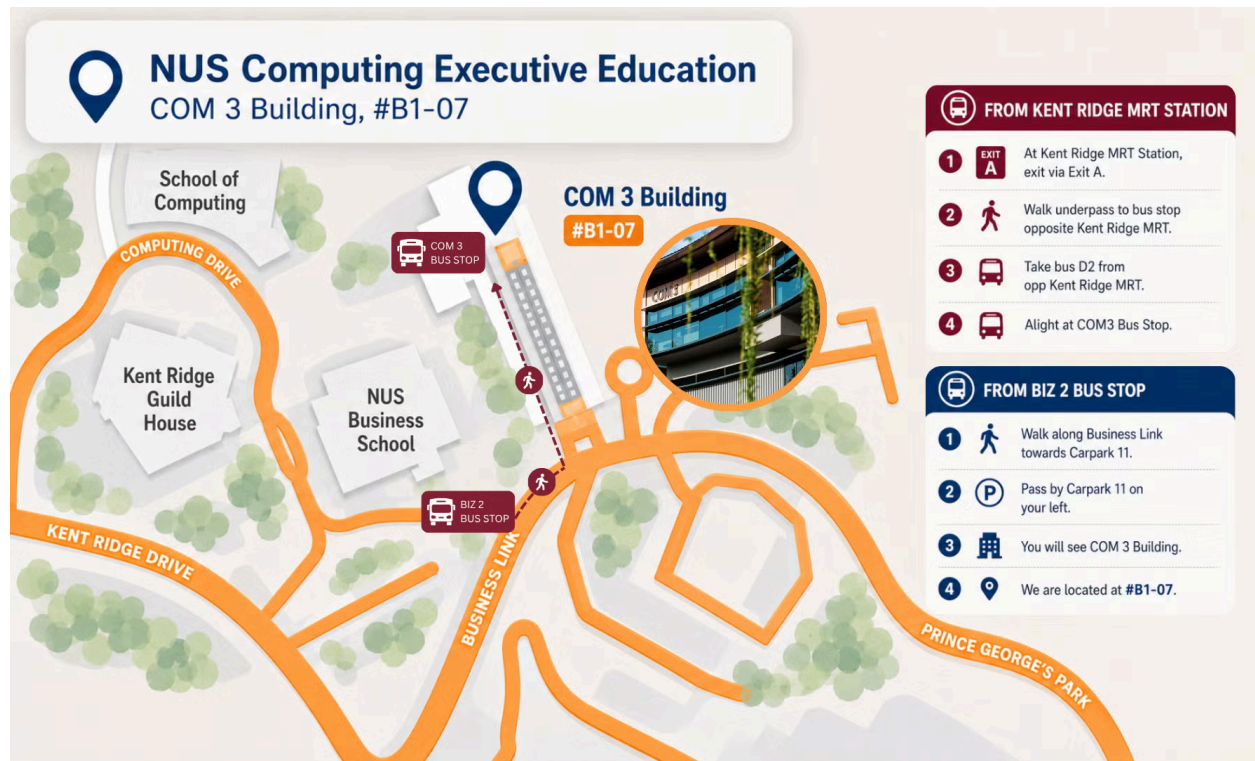

From Jurong

- Drive along Ayer Rajah Expressway (AYE) towards City
- Take Exit 9 for Clementi Rd
- Keep right at the fork, follow signs for Clementi Rd/West Coast H'way and merge onto Clementi Rd/University Flyover
- Continue on Clementi Rd for 1.1km
- Use the second from the left lane to turn left onto Kent Ridge Crescent
- After 100m, turn right onto Kent Ridge Drive
- Turn left after Mochtar Riady Building (on the left)
- Turn left onto Research Link (Car Park 11) or via Innovation 4.0 (Car Park 11B). We are at the COM3 SEA Building, #B1-27.

What is the course fee and what does it include?

The fee covers tuition, learning materials, and meals/refreshments during sessions. The price is SGD1,000 (excluding GST) per session.

There will be a 20% early bird special if one registers and pays by 30 September 2026. The early bird discount cannot be combined with other promotions. Alumni discounts, corporate discounts and SkillsFuture funding are not applicable to the CXO Series.

The CXO Series is designed as a flexible executive learning experience, allowing participants to select topics most relevant to their leadership priorities. As participants may attend different combinations of sessions, certificates are not issued.

How do I register?

Interested participants can submit their registration via the [\[CXO%20Series%20Registration%20Form\]CXO Series Registration Form](#), indicating the session(s) they wish to attend. As places are limited, early registration is encouraged.

Applications will be reviewed, and applicants will be informed of the outcome within 3–5 working days. Successful applicants will then receive instructions to make payment within 14 days and confirm their place.

If a session is fully subscribed, eligible applicants may be placed on a waitlist and will be contacted if a place becomes available.

Can my company be invoiced directly?

We currently do not have this option so you may have to pay first and get reimbursement from your company or get someone from the company to pay for you via corporate card.

Can I send a colleague if I can no longer attend?

To ensure a high-quality learning experience, each cohort is carefully curated. Selection is based primarily on applicants' seniority and leadership responsibilities, as well as seat availability. As places are individually allocated, confirmed registrations are non-transferable.

Can organisations register multiple participants?

Yes. Organisations are welcome to nominate multiple senior leaders. Each application will be reviewed individually to ensure an appropriate mix of participants and maximise peer learning.

What is the refund policy?

Fees are non-refundable after payment. If you are unable to attend your registered session, you may transfer your registration to another CXO Series session during 16–30 November 2026, subject to availability.

What happens if a session is cancelled?

It is unlikely but in case this happens, you will be informed via WhatsApp and email at least 12 hours before. You may transfer your registration to another CXO Series session during 16–30 November 2026, subject to availability, or given a refund.

Can I bring a specific business challenge or company-related scenario for discussion during the session?

We encourage you to submit your business challenges, case studies, or questions at least two weeks before the programme begins. While we may not be able to discuss every submission due to time constraints, the faculty will aim to address one or two cases that are particularly relevant or of broad interest during the session. You are also welcome to discuss your specific challenges with the faculty during the networking breaks.
